

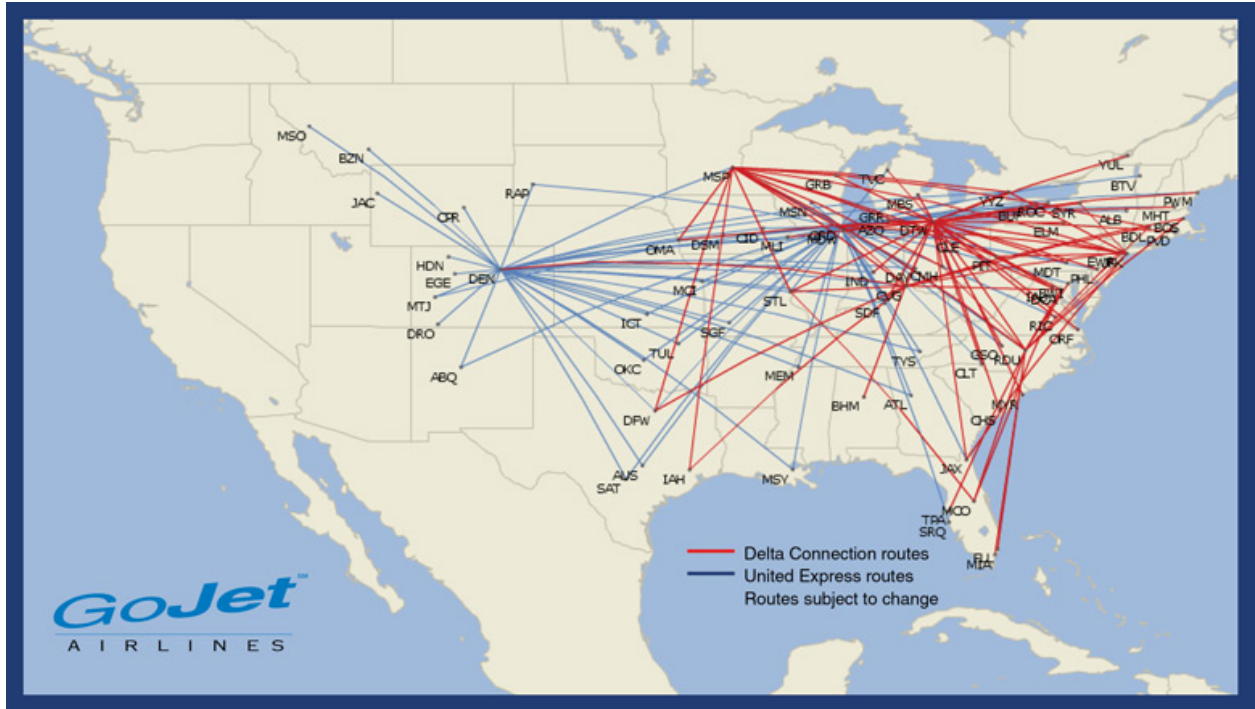


GoJet Airlines

GoJet Airlines is a subsidiary of Trans States Holdings based in Bridgeton, Missouri. The airline was established in 2005 to operate as a United Express feeder carrier on behalf of United Airlines using 70-seat Canadair CRJ-700 regional jets. GoJet began United Express flights from Albuquerque to Chicago on October 26, 2014 and added Denver service shortly afterwards. These services supplement United Airlines mainline and other United Express carriers and do not operate on a consistent basis. GoJet ended its service to Albuquerque on January 17, 2020 and now operates its CRJ-700's with only 55 seats and only in the eastern half of the United States. The airline also flew as Delta Connection on behalf of Delta Air Lines from 2012 through 2020 but had no Delta service in New Mexico. GoJet pilots use the call sign "Lindbergh" after the famous aviator Charles Lindbergh when communicating with air traffic control.
