
Stahmann Farms Aviation

Stahmann Farms, INC. of Las Cruces, New Mexico operated a commuter airline division in 1980 with two daily roundtrip flights on a Santa Fe-Albuquerque-Las Cruces routing using Cessna 421 aircraft. The carrier initiated its service by June 30, 1980 following the closure of Zia Airlines however by the fall of 1980 the carrier was forced to move from the main terminal of the Albuquerque Sunport to the old terminal due to a lack of space. Stahmann then claimed that passengers were unaware of their service and the airline was shut down later that same year. Stahmann Farms had also planned to service Colorado Springs, Colorado from Albuquerque but the service had not started.
