HISTORY

This historical information was extracted and summarized from official NTSB Identification Report CEN09FA195. Refer to that document for more details.

On March 9, 2009, about 0540 MDT, the subject airplane was destroyed upon impact with terrain following inadvertent flight into instrument conditions near Golden, New Mexico. The pilot was <u>not</u> instrument rated. Both the private pilot owner and the passenger were fatally injured in the crash. The two occupants were making a daily commute to Los Alamos, NM, from Edgewood, NM, when the accident occurred. Two postmortem blood samples (at 0.075 and 0.092 mg/dL ethanol) from the pilot were consistent with the effects of alcohol impairment.

On May 24, 2010, crash explorers visited the area and found crash debris. The location is right next to a dirt road. The local area was burned after impact. Very little debris was found, probably due to easy access to the site that allowed recovery crews to do a very complete cleanup.
