



Clayton Municipal Airpark

The Clayton Municipal Airpark is a general aviation airport serving Clayton and Union County, New Mexico. It is located two miles east of the town of Clayton and has two paved runways.

During the late 1960's, commercial air service was proposed by Trans Central Airlines, a commuter airline operating Cessna 402 aircraft. Trans Central had planned a route between Denver and Amarillo that would have made stops at Clayton as well as other communities in Colorado and Texas however the service never began.
