





Swift Air Eastern Air Lines iAero Airways

Swift Air was a charter airline founded in 1997 and originally based in Phoenix, Arizona. The carrier operated Boeing 737-300's, -400's, and -800's. By 2017, Swift Air was operating casino gambling junket charter flights from Albuquerque to Wendover, Nevada. The carrier also performed deportation flights from Albuquerque to Guatemala City, Guatemala and San Pedro Sula, Honduras during 2017 through 2018. In mid-2017, Swift Air acquired the Boeing 737 fleet of a new Eastern Air Lines that began in 2015 and was based in Miami, Florida. Eastern formerly flew the 737-700 and 737-800 models and operated presidential campaign charters through Albuquerque and Las Cruces in 2016. Dynamic Airways bought out the rights to the Eastern name in 2018 and now operates Boeing 767's and 777's under the Eastern brand.

In 2019 Swift Air became a subsidiary of iAero Group with headquarters in Greensboro, North Carolina and rebranded itself as iAero Airways on January 1, 2020. The carrier then operated charters from Albuquerque to Laughlin and Reno, Nevada on behalf of Caesar's Entertainment until early 2022. Charters for sports teams and other entities were also flown though Albuquerque. iAero filed for bankruptcy in September, 2023 and operated two more sports charter flights to Albuquerque in March, 2024 before shutting down on April 6, 2024.
